

# Councilwoman Cyndi Lamm

Cyndi Lamm was elected to Lincoln's City Council on May 5, 2015, winning a long-time Democrat held district with 51% of the vote. She proudly serves the citizens of District 1 which covers northeast Lincoln. As Vice-Chairwoman, she is tasked with bringing a voice of balance in the chamber to votes on key legislation.

As part of the council's leadership team, Lamm serves on the following Council Committees and Boards: Joint Budget; Performance Audit; Problem Resolution Team; Railroad Transportation District; Telecommunications/Cable Television Advisory Board; 33rd & Cornhusker Safety Project Steering Committee.

A proud resident of Lincoln, Cyndi attended Lincoln High School where she later obtained her Associate of Arts degree at Southeast Community College. Cyndi went on to earn her Bachelor's with High Distinction from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln majoring in communications and minoring in political science and ethnic studies. She journeyed on to earn her Juris Doctorate with High Distinction from the University of Nebraska College of Law. Additional academic honors included: Order of the Coif, Regents Scholarship recipient, awards in Contracts, Juvenile Law, Construction Law, and Advanced Trial Advocacy. She was an Executive Editor of the Nebraska Law Review, a member of the Nebraska College of Law National Moot Court Team and President of the Student Chapter NATA/ATLA.

In 2009, Cyndi attended and graduated from one of the oldest and most respected programs for developing defense trial advocacy, Stanford University's intensive and invigorating IADC Trial Academy.

As an educator, Cyndi has taught Legal Research & Writing as an adjunct professor at the University of Nebraska College of Law from 2006 to 2014. She has also previously instructed the College of Law's summer Pre-Law Institute, an intensive 4-week law school experience for minority students considering law school or a legal career.

Prior to attending law school, Cyndi served as a Legislative Aide for then-State Senator Mike Foley. After law school, she served as a judicial law clerk under the mentorship of Justice Kenneth Stephan at the Nebraska Supreme Court. Cyndi launched out on her own after serving clients as a litigation attorney with Lincoln's oldest and most prestigious law firms – Baylor Evnen.

Cyndi is committed to her community and plays leadership roles in several organizations – actively serving on the Boards of Directors of the People's City Mission, the Autism Family Network, and the Advocacy Partnership for People with Special Needs, and Child Evangelism Fellowship. Cyndi has also served on the Board of the Lincoln Community Playhouse and has been a regular presenter for the Nebraska Safety Council. She and her husband, Tim, are active at Christ Place Church in Lincoln.
